Stop complaining to each other.' Jesus came to put an end to our endless arguments. About who sinned, who can judge, and who was in the right.

How do we deal with people we disagree with? When there is a disagreement, what weapons do we respond with? What constitutes a proof that can end an argument.

Elijah in todays first Reading presented 'fire-proof' evidence by soaking wood in water and persuading God to set fire to it. The response of the Queen to the humiliation of her holy men was to swear Elijah would die. We mightn't take such extreme measures to prove our points, but doesn't Paul have a point when he says that our disagreements end in grudges, tempers lost, raised voices, namecalling and spitefulness?

'The Gospel of John shows Jesus in Capernaum disputing with those who (understandably) can't swallow his claim to be flesh that is eaten for eternal life. Reading the Gospels sometimes feels like being present at an extended series of arguments. Between the apostles themselves, or Jesus and those who come face to face with him.

Jesus appeals to us like a mother speaking to her bickering children, 'stop complaining to each other. Come to me. Let me feed you. Let me lift you up. Let me carry you.'
